Dear Members and friends,

Sadly during recent months we have seen the passing of another PSM recipient Dr Alice Rigney. Dr Rigney was the principal of Kurna Plains School for Aboriginal students in Adelaide's north, and was been recognised for making a significant contribution to the preservation of the Kurna language.

Dr Rigney who was a Narungga Kurna elder died just 24 hours after her husband Lester Rigney was buried on their country of birth at Point Pearce, on South Australia's Yorke Peninsula. A memorial service organised by the Department of Premier and Cabinet to celebrate her life was held on June 7th at University of Adelaide Bonython Hall. Her son, Professor Lester-Irabinna Rigney, described his mother as a matriarch of the Kurna and Narrunga nation.

We also would like to acknowledge the passing on 25 May this year the passing of Dianne Cordes, wife of Dene Cordes. Dene was a long time president of the association. Dianne was a friend to many of us and an amazing woman as those who attended her funeral service were able to attest. She was both soul mate and partner to Dene and both lived a life full to the brim with activities and services to the community.

David Roche Exhibition Tour by PSMA SA

On Friday 16 June 2017, eighteen PSMA members, their partners and friends visited the David Roche art exhibition in Melbourne Street, North Adelaide.

The exhibition features the private collection of antiques, paintings and art pieces of the late David J Roche AM (1930-2013), 3000 items in all, which he accumulated over his lifetime from all around the world. The exhibition is housed in David's private residence and an adjoining purpose-built gallery, which will ensure this unique collection is preserved for future generations to see.

As well as being an avid art collector, David was also a highly awarded dog breeder and international show dog judge. Much of his collection is influenced by his love of dogs. Tour guides were on hand to lead attendees around the exhibition and provide background information on particular items of interest, which greatly added to the experience.

Following the tour attendees met for lunch in The Store Café to cap off a particularly enjoyable morning.

Answer to question about the panels on the photo page 3. *The panels are to protect 2 people sitting one on each side of the fire (when alight) from getting overheated and burns to the face.*

The green panel can be moved up and down to the most appropriate position to afford protection
